Digging In

1. **Read 2 Peter 1:3-7.** What resources are promised to Christians in verses 3-4?
2. Why are these resources essential for obeying the exhortations that begin in v. 5?
3. How do the promises in vss. 3-4 give us hope and motivation for pursuing godliness?
4. A key phrase which begins **v. 5** is *make every effort*. How is this phrase used in **Ephesians 4:3** and **Hebrews 12:14**?
5. **Read Eph 2:8-10.** How are God's grace and our responsibility both seen in these verses?
6. **Read Phil 2:12-13.** How does this passage teach about God's role and our role in Christian growth?
7. **Read John 15:4-5.** According to Jesus, what do we need to do to bear fruit? Put vss. 4-5 in your own words.
8. **Read Titus 2:11-14.** When grace really takes root in a person's life, what are the natural results?
