### Galatians 3:1-14

#### Getting Started

What does it mean to believe in Christ?

#### Digging In

1. **Read Gal 3:1-5.** Like a prosecutor in a court of law, Paul bombards the Galatians with a barrage of convicting questions. Make a list of the questions he poses in the first five verses.
2. What is the conclusion toward which Paul is trying to drive the Galatians in these verses?
3. **Read Gal 3:6-9.** In this next section, Paul challenges the Galatians to consider the example of Abraham. How was Abraham made righteous before God?
4. How can we become Abraham's spiritual children?
5. How is God's plan to justify the Gentiles **by faith** seen in the Old Testament? (vss. 8-9)
6. **Read Gal 3:10-14.** What's the problem with relying on the law to pursue righteousness before God?
7. Why are all human beings under the curse of the law? (v. 10; James 2:10)
8. Do you think it's possible for anyone to perfectly obey the law? Why or why not?
9. How does even the law itself teach that we are justified by faith? (v. 11)
10. How did Jesus redeem us from the curse of the law? (vss. 13-14; 2 Cor 5:21)



#### Getting Personal

- Have you personally been justified by faith? Explain.
- Are there some ways in which you've begun with grace but have turned to the law in your pursuit of godliness?
- We are *justified* by faith and *sanctified* by faith. Why is faith absolutely essential for *being made right* with God, and for *growing in righteousness*?
