Questions for Reflection and Discussion

Raising the Bar Matthew 5:31-48

Getting Started

What did you do or say as a child in order to strengthen an oath – to convince people you really meant what you said?

Digging In

- 1. **Read 5:31-32.** The Jews of Jesus' day would sometimes use minor matters as an excuse to get a divorce. How does Jesus raise the bar?
- 2. **Read 5:33-37.** What are some things people say in order to emphasize the truthfulness of what they're saying?



- 3. What do you think Jesus meant in v. 37? What are the practical implications of this with regard to daily living?
- 4. **Read 5:38-42.** Jews were using the *law of retaliation* to exact vengeance. How does Jesus raise the bar from justice to mercy?
- 5. Practically speaking, how do you think we should apply these verses today?
- 6. **Read 5:43-48**. Jesus says that when we love our enemies we are *sons of our Father in heaven*. What do you think is meant by this phrase? (cf. v. 9)
- 7. How does loving our enemies make us unique ... distinct?
- 8. What do you think Jesus means in v. 20? How are we to apply this verse to our lives?

What Now?

- How does this passage contribute to our understanding of what it means to be a citizen of the kingdom of God –
 a genuine follower of Christ?
- None of us can be perfect, and yet this is the standard Jesus establishes. How are we to deal with this *performance gap*?
- People cope with the performance in various ways. Some lower the requirements (legalists), try harder, or just give up. What does it mean to *climb in hope?*
