Getting Started

Digging In

- 1. **Read Matthew 9:35-38.** What are the main points that Matthew makes in summarizing Jesus' ministry. (Cf. Matt 4:23)
- 2. For review: what does it mean to preach the good news of the kingdom?
- 3. What is the relationship between preaching the kingdom and preaching the gospel? (Cf. supplementary handout)
- 4. Jesus did not live in a monastery. He was out among the crowds. How can we follow his example?
- 5. How did Jesus respond when he saw the crowds?
- 6. Why did he have compassion on them?
- 7. What do you think it means that the people were harassed and helpless?
- 8. How are people around us *harassed and helpless* today?
- 9. How can we respond with compassion? Be specific.
- 10. In what ways is the harvest plentiful today?
- 11. The clear command of v. 38 is to pray for more workers. What are some specific ways in which we can do this?

Getting Personal

- Taking an honest look at your life, would you say that you see the crowds as a problem, or as a potential harvest?
- Is there a specific way in which you feel God is calling you to show compassion to those around you? Is there a need to which he is calling you to respond?
- How can we make prayer for workers a regular part of our lives?
