- 2. Paraphrase Jesus' response in v. 22.
- 3. Read Matthew 18:23-34. Write a brief summary of the parable. So there's this king
- 4. This was a huge debt one that the servant could never hope to repay. How did the king respond to his plea for mercy?
- 5. How did the servant respond to his fellow-servant's plea for mercy?
- 6. What did the other servants do when they saw what had happened?
- 7. Paraphrase the king's response in vv. 32-34.
- 8. What is the key principle Jesus is teaching in this parable? (cf. Colossians 3:13)
- 9. What do you think Jesus is saying in v. 35?
 - How is forgiveness a distinguishing mark of God's people?
 - How does a lack of forgiveness undercut our fellowship with God?
