Getting Started

What does it mean when we talk about someone having an agenda?

Digging In

- 1. Read Neh 1:1-5. Describe the problems the people were experiencing. See how many you can find.
- 2. How would these problems have hindered the rebuilding of the walls of Jerusalem?
- 3. Read vss. 6-11. What was Nehemiah's initial response when he heard of the people's outcry?
- 4. How did he demonstrate maturity in handling the problem? (v. 7a; see also Proverbs 16:32 and 29:11)
- 5. How did Nehemiah deal with the problem?
- 6. Read vss. 12-13. How did the people respond?
- 7. Read vss. 14-19. In what ways was Nehemiah himself an example of selflessness?
- 8. How did this demonstrate a commitment to God's agenda rather than his own?

Getting Personal

- Write a paraphrase of Matthew 6:33.
- In practical terms, what does it look like to seek first the kingdom of God?
- What does it mean to seek *his righteousness*?
- Generally speaking, what are some ways that we as Christians can put God's kingdom God's agenda first in our lives?
- What is God saying to you personally through Neh 5 and Matthew 6:33?
- How can you apply Matt 6:33 to your life?
